

# Recycling reminder

Confused about what goes in your recycling bin? Need some help?

Here are a few tips to help you...

Only the items listed below can be recycled at home in your recycling bin.

- ✓ cans
- ✓ tins
- ✓ plastic bottles (not lids)
- ✓ cardboard
- ✓ yellow pages
- ✓ glass (not light bulbs)
- ✓ all paper including newspapers
- ✓ envelopes and magazines
- ✓ yoghurt pots
- ✓ plastic tubs and trays



Please make sure all items are rinsed out before placing in your recycling bin.

If any items that cannot be recycled are seen in your bin it will not be emptied.

Please put recycling items in the bin loose and not in plastic bags. Plastic bags are not recyclable. The following are often incorrectly put into recycling bins:

- ✗ textiles
- ✗ video tapes
- ✗ food waste
- ✗ plastic carrier bags
