What we do

In 2001 DATs started to take on a new and more formal role, which included direct commissioning of services. The DAT has budgets both for the commissioning of adult drug treatment services and for young people's prevention and treatment services.

For 2004-05, the adult budget is £2,834,000 and the young people's budget is £958,000. Both budgets are managed by DAT commissioners and decisions on expenditure are made by multi-agency commissioning groups.

The DAT Communities and Reducing Supply sub groups do not hold their own budgets but aim to influence and make recommendations to relevant agencies who sit on these groups and who do have budgets, e.g. the Police, Crime & Disorder Reduction Partnerships, 'Supporting People'.



Who are we?

Surrey Drug Action Team (DAT) was set up in 1995 as a county-wide partnership for tackling substance misuse and drug related antisocial behaviour.

The team brings together all agencies with a responsibility for funding/providing specific drug services (education, prevention, treatment) and envisaging coercive interventions (law enforcement).

By being responsible for implementing the National Drug Strategy at local level, Surrey DAT aims to make Surrey a Healthier and Safer place to live.
