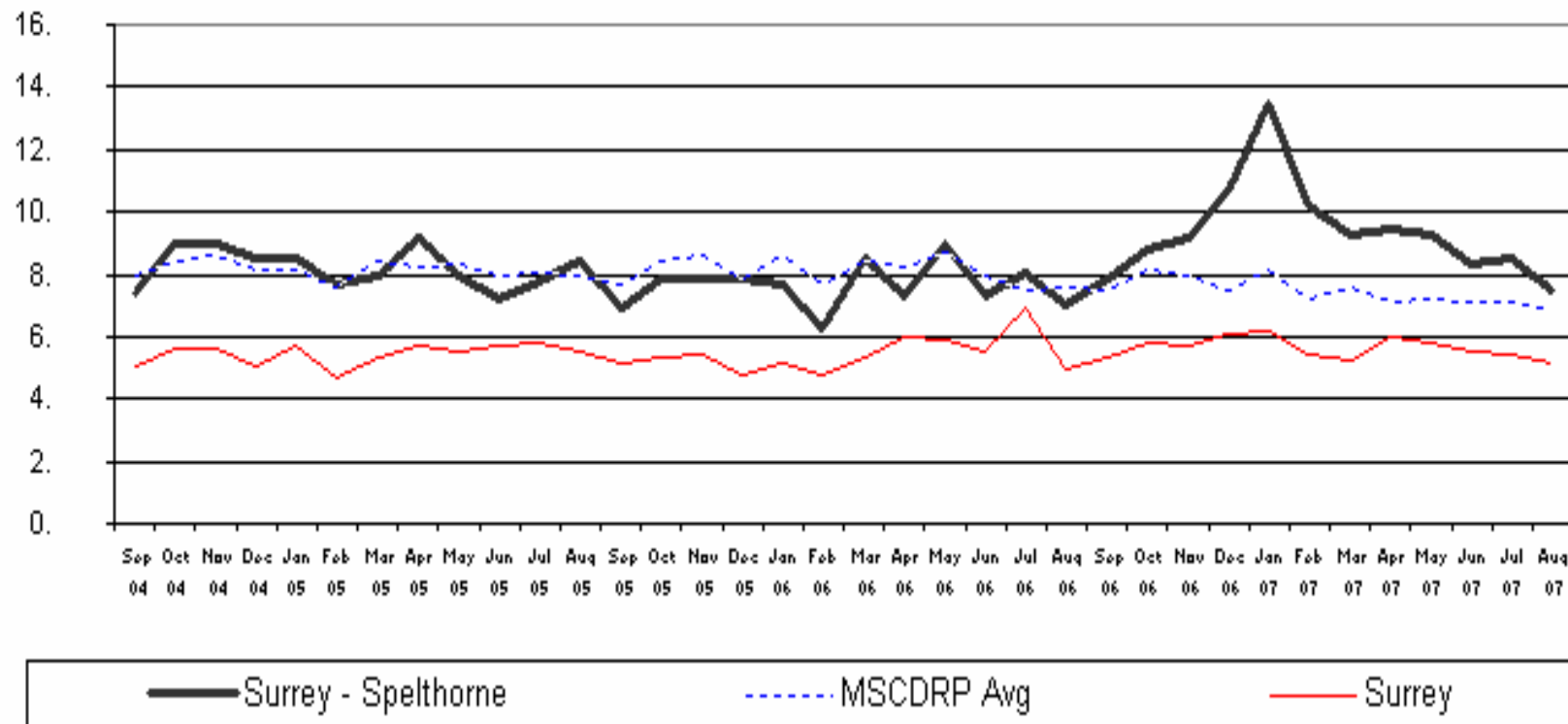

Performance

- Home Office PSA
 - 15.5% reduction over three years. Unrealistic imposed target. Currently on course for 2.6% rise compared to base year.
- Individual crime types
 - Good** – Robbery, Serious violent crime, Criminal damage
 - Improving** - Vehicle crime
 - Not so good** Burglary, Common assault
- Perception surveys
 - Perception of ASB being a real problem halved in 3 years
- Public consultation
 - area forums & LSP Assembly

- Linked to the revised Community Plan and the County Community Safety Agreement
- National Standards



Conclusions

- Partnership – statistically performance is poor, but feedback via survey, meetings and reduced complaints is good. Medium to long term projects cannot be measured by yearly figures.
- Council – the CDRP provides Value for Money and at the same time fulfilling statutory requirement
