Flying abroad this summer? Here's how to offet your family's holiday flight

Looking forward to some sunshine, sightseeing or simply switching off? If your family is heading abroad by plane this summer, it is worth considering the environmental impact of your journey.

Flights are one of the biggest contributors to personal carbon emissions. A single return trip can release hundreds or even thousands of kilograms of carbon dioxide per person. For a family of four, that can mean several tonnes of emissions in just one holiday.

### Why Offset Your Flight?

Offsetting means paying to support projects that reduce emissions elsewhere. This could include planting trees, protecting forests or building clean energy in areas that need it most. It helps balance the carbon your trip creates and supports communities working on climate solutions.

While avoiding flights altogether is the best option for the planet, many families understandably want to travel. Offsetting is a practical way to travel more responsibly.

### **How to Offset Your Flight in Three Easy Steps**

- Step one: Calculate your emissions Use a simple online calculator. Two trusted ones are <a href="Atmosfair">Atmosfair</a> and <a href="MyClimate">MyClimate</a>. Just enter your flight details and number of travellers.
- Step two: Choose a project Both websites offer verified projects with global impact, including reforestation, wind power and clean cooking initiatives. These are certified by groups such as Gold Standard and Verified Carbon Standard.
- **Step three: Make your payment** Once you select a project, you can offset your emissions with a secure payment. It only takes a few minutes.

### Typical Offset Costs for a Family of Four (Return Flights)

Destination	Approximate Total CO <sub>2</sub>	Cost to Offset
Spain or Portugal	1 tonne	£20 to £28
Italy or Greece	1.5 tonnes	£30 to £40
New York (USA)	6 tonnes	£100 to £130
Florida or California	a 8 tonnes	£130 to £170

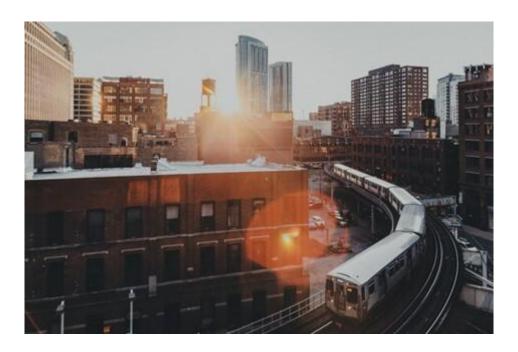
These estimates are for two adults and two children flying economy. Costs vary slightly by provider.

- Choose direct flights when possible
- Pack lighter to reduce fuel use
- Use public transport or walk once you arrive

- 4. **Puff: Wonders of the Reef** *Netflix / Rated U* Told through the eyes of a baby pufferfish, this colourful underwater adventure is perfect for younger children. Short, gentle and packed with coral reef magic.
- 5. **Night on Earth** *Netflix / Rated PG* Using amazing night-vision technology, this series reveals the hidden lives of animals after dark. From desert lions to forest frogs, it is full of surprises. Best for ages 9 and up.
- 6. **Wild Isles** *BBC iPlayer / Rated PG* A celebration of wildlife in the UK, from orcas in Scotland to butterflies in chalk meadows. This is a brilliant reminder that nature is all around us, not just far away.
- 7. **Planet Earth II** *BBC iPlayer / Rated PG* From high mountains to city streets, this series showcases life in every corner of the planet. It is visually stunning and full of action and facts. Good for a wide age range.
