Simple summer tips

You can keep cool and comfortable in summer without using much electricity. On very hot days, keep windows and curtains closed during the warmest hours to trap cooler air inside and stop heat from building up. In the evening or early morning, open them to let in fresh air when temperatures are lower. This simple habit reduces the need for electric fans or air conditioning.

Light coloured curtains or blinds help reflect sunlight and keep rooms cooler. If you can, use outdoor shading such as climbing plants or awnings to block direct sun before it reaches your windows.

Store a jug of water in the fridge so you always have a cold drink without running the tap until the water cools. Water plants in the garden early in the morning or late in the evening to make the most of the water you use and avoid waste.

Surrey County Council invites residents to contribute to the Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS), a crucial plan aiming to restore and enhance biodiversity across the county. The consultation is open until 25 September 2025, and your input is vital.

What is the LNRS?

The LNRS is a spatial strategy developed under the Environment Act 2021, identifying areas to improve nature and provide environmental benefits such as carbon sequestration, flood regulation, and improved access to green space.

- **Online Survey**: Share your views on priorities for nature recovery, habitat improvements, and biodiversity goals.
- Interactive Map: Identify and comment on local areas important for wildlife and nature recovery.
- Workshops and Events: Engage with experts and community members to discuss and shape the strategy.
