

At the end of October, the Government announced plans to reorganise local government in Surrey by replacing the current 12 councils with two new unitary authorities. While we had supported an alternative proposal for three authorities, we remain committed to working constructively to shape this transition and ensure the best possible outcomes for our residents. We understand that many residents have expressed concerns about the increasing number of Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) across the Borough. Please be assured that we share these concerns and have begun implementing a clear action plan to strengthen the management and regulation of HMOs. All HMOs must be safe, well-managed, and considerate of the surrounding community. You can find more information on page 17. If you are experiencing issues with an HMO in your area, please let us know by reporting it at www.spelthorne.gov.uk/report.

As always, our priority is making Spelthorne a great place to live, work and enjoy. If you have any suggestions for us or there's anything we can improve or fix, please do reach out and we will do our best to assist. We're also keen to hear any positive feedback.


Message from the Mayor

If your name is not on the Register, you can apply to be added by visiting www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Why it matters

The Electoral Register is used for all elections, so being included ensures you can exercise your right to vote.

In addition, credit reference agencies use the Register to verify your address when you apply for financial products such as:

- Mortgages
- Loans
- Credit cards
- Mobile phone contracts
- Hire purchase agreements

If you're not listed on the Electoral Register, you may find it harder to access credit or secure financial agreements.

Check your registration status and make sure your details are up to date. It only takes a few minutes and can save you problems later on.

Elmsleigh car parks go ticketless with smart parking system

Spelthorne Borough Council is pleased to announce that a new ticketless parking system was introduced at the Elmsleigh surface and multi-storey car parks in Staines-upon-Thames at the end of October.

The upgraded system uses automatic number plate recognition technology, allowing drivers to enter the car park without needing to stop and collect a paper ticket. When ready to leave, users simply enter their vehicle registration number at a payment machine and pay using cash or card.

For an even quicker experience, motorists can pay via the RingGo app*. bypassing the payment machines entirely for a seamless, contactless departure.

This modernised system will significantly improve the parking experience by:

- Speeding up entry and exit, especially during peak times
- Providing multiple convenient payment options including card, cash and RingGo payments
- Eliminating paper tickets, and the risk of losing a ticket
- Introducing more payment machines

It's a major step forward in modernising local infrastructure and making visits to Staines-upon-Thames smoother and more convenient, particularly during busy periods. And because it's paperless, it's more environmentally friendly.

Spelthorne calls for change to gambling laws

Spelthorne Borough Council has ioined over 40 local authorities across the UK in a coordinated call for urgent reform of the country's outdated gambling laws.

At its Full Council meeting in July, councillors voted to support a national campaign led by Brent Council, urging the Government to modernise the Gambling Act 2005. The motion proposed by Cllr Harry Boparai and seconded by Cllr Katherine Rutherford called for councils to

be granted powers to implement stronger safeguards to better protect communities from gambling-related harm and to work with local health and voluntary sector partners to signpost residents to gambling addiction support and education initiatives.

The joint call has been formally submitted in a letter to the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport, Lisa Nandy.

Volunteer help needed

We're a local charity helping Spelthorne's elderly or less able residents get to medical appointments. Since the 1970s, we've averaged nearly 900 trips a year - over 21.000 miles driven in the last two vears. But we sometimes have to turn down requests due to a lack of available drivers.

We need more volunteers - both drivers and duty officers. Drivers use their own cars, choose when to work. and receive a mileage allowance. Duty officers work from home, taking client calls on our mobile weekday mornings, 10am-12pm, about one week in five.

Drivers (all DBS-checked) collect clients, take them to appointments, and assist as needed. Our clients pay a small, flat-rate charge (currently £4) for trips to local surgeries, health centres, dentists, etc. Hospital trips and those to all places outside Spelthorne are charged at 50p a mile.



Celebrating two historic businesses on their retirement

Spelthorne Borough Council has paid tribute to two of the Borough's most cherished and long-serving family businesses, Muggeridge Furniture Store and Lewis & Sons, following their retirement and closure in the summer after decades of exceptional service to the local community.

Both businesses have played a significant role in shaping the character and vibrancy of Spelthorne's high streets, earning the respect and loyalty of generations of residents.

Established in 1918, Muggeridge Furniture Store in Ashford has served the Borough for more than a century. Renowned for its dedication to quality craftsmanship, excellent customer service and strong community values, the business has been a familiar and trusted presence in Spelthorne for multiple generations.

Founded in 1896 in Staines, Lewis & Sons stands as one of the oldest family businesses in Spelthorne, with an extraordinary 129 years of continuous service. Known for its reliability, personal service, and long-standing community ties, the business has been a key fixture on the local high street throughout modern history.

In recognition of their enduring legacies, commemorative shields were presented to both companies in special ceremonies led by senior representatives of the Council.

The closure of Muggeridge Furniture Store and Lewis & Sons marks the end of two important chapters in Spelthorne's retail and community history. They have been vital parts of the Borough's social fabric, offering not just goods and services, but continuity, connection and care. Spelthorne Borough Council extends its sincere thanks and warmest wishes to both families.





Supporting Swifts and biodiversity in Spelthorne

In 2020, Swifts were officially added to the UK's Red List of birds most at risk and in urgent need of conservation. This comes as no surprise, with populations having declined by a staggering 66% between 1995 and 2022. The latest State of Nature report highlights climate change and changes in land management as major drivers of this widespread decline in UK wildlife.

In response, Talking Tree CIC has launched a local initiative to support biodiversity and help protect Swifts in Spelthorne. With generous funding from Dandara Living, Talking Tree has purchased five Swift bricks - specialised nest boxes designed to support these migratory birds.

Working in partnership with Saxon Primary School in Shepperton, the bricks have now been installed into the school's playground wall, creating safe, long-term nesting sites for returning Swifts during their annual migration between May and July. Beyond conservation, this project offers a unique learning experience for students, who will be able to observe the birds and engage directly with the Swift Project.

Further funding from Dandara Living is available to expand this initiative. If you are a school or community group interested in creating biodiversity projects on your site, please get in touch with talkingtreece@gmail. com to find out more.

The award recognised the Council's ambitious delivery of one of the world's most energy-efficient and sustainable leisure centres, built to strict Passivhaus standards.

Opened in October 2024, Eclipse was developed to replace an ageing leisure centre, with extensive community consultation and a focus on future-proofing local health and wellbeing needs. Beyond its cuttingedge design, Eclipse serves as a national example, helping other councils explore similar sustainable leisure projects.

Spelthorne Borough Council was honoured to welcome His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester on Tuesday 30 September, as part of a special visit celebrating the success and innovation of the Eclipse Leisure Centre in Staines-upon-Thames.

Opened in October 2024, Eclipse is a state-of-the-art community facility that has quickly become a flagship for health, wellbeing, and sustainability in the Borough. During his visit, The Duke toured the impressive facilities and met a wide range of community users. His Royal Highness also observed several activities, including a Spelthorne Parkinson's Group gym session, a U3A pickleball game, table tennis, and a school swimming lesson, showcasing the centre's inclusive approach and community spirit.

The visit concluded with the unveiling of a commemorative plague by The Duke, marking the occasion and recognising Eclipse's contribution to health, wellbeing, and sustainability across Spelthorne.

Just weeks later, on Saturday 18 October, the centre celebrated its first anniversary with a lively community open day led by the Mayor, Council Leader and special guest Diana Moran BEM, the iconic "Green Goddess" fitness expert. Families enjoyed a packed programme of activities including swimming, active play and bounce, clip and climb, free gymnastics and personal training taster sessions, and face painting. The Mayor cut a birthday cake and contributions from selected activities were donated to the Mayor's charities.

Designed for minimal environmental impact, Eclipse has been built to rigorous Passivhaus standards, incorporating innovative technologies such as heat recovery and watersaving microfiltration systems. Its sustainable design and community impact have earned national acclaim, with Eclipse shortlisted for numerous construction and environmental awards, including the National Sustainability Awards and Constructing Excellence SECBE Awards.

Earlier this year, the Centre won silver at the iESE Public Sector Transformation Awards, was named Leisure Facility of the Year by Business Awards UK in August, and most recently was crowned Retail and Leisure Project of the Year at the Structural Timber Awards.

Changes to HMO development rights

To address concerns raised by residents, Spelthorne Council has introduced new planning controls to manage the growth of Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) across the Borough.

An Article 4 Direction came into effect in August for Staines, Ashford North & Stanwell South, and Stanwell North wards, removing permitted development rights that allow a house to be converted into a small HMO (accommodating up to six individuals) without planning permission. Now properties in these wards require full planning permission to become a HMO.

To ensure a consistent approach across the Borough, the Council has introduced a second Article 4 Direction that will apply to all other wards in Spelthorne. Subject to confirmation, this wider direction is due to come into effect on 13 March 2026.

Planning permission is already required for large HMOs (for seven or more occupants), and this remains unchanged.

Please use litter bins responsibly

We are increasingly seeing public litter bins across the borough being misused.

These bins are provided to help people dispose of small, on-the-go items, such as snack wrappers, takeout cups and packaging. However, we are now encountering large amounts of household waste, garden debris and food waste being dumped in and around these bins.

This kind of misuse creates serious hygiene and public health issues, attracts vermin, and makes our high streets and shared spaces unpleasant for everyone. It also disrupts our cleaning schedules, meaning more time and resources are spent dealing with misuse rather than keeping streets clean.


Please help us keep our borough clean and safe for all by using litter bins correctly. If you have household waste or larger items, these should be disposed of through the appropriate household collection services or taken to a recycling centre.

Together, we can maintain a cleaner, healthier environment for everyone.

Local Government Reorganisation

The Government recently announced its decision to replace Surrey's 12 councils with two new unitary authorities.

The announcement means that an East Surrey unitary will replace the geographic areas of Elmbridge, Epsom & Ewell, Mole Valley, Reigate & Banstead, and Tandridge councils; and a West Surrey unitary will replace the geographic areas of Guildford, Runnymede, Spelthorne, Surrey Heath, Waverley and Woking councils.



Surrey County Council, along with the 11 district and borough councils, will be abolished, with the two new unitary authorities taking responsibility for services such as adult social care, children's services, waste and recycling, local planning and highways.

Done in the right way, the two unitary model creates an opportunity to improve services for residents and businesses focused on their local communities.

Whilst Local Government Reorganisation will deliver financial savings over the long-term, the Government has recognised that Woking Council's debt cannot be resolved solely at the local level and has announced a first tranche of debt relief that will aid in the reduction of Woking's debt, subject to progress with its asset rationalisation programme.

Leader of Spelthorne Borough Council, Cllr Joanne Sexton, said: "Although we supported an alternative proposal for three unitary authorities, we are determined to use this once-in-a-generation opportunity to reshape local government around the needs and priorities of our residents. While change of this scale brings challenges, it also unlocks the potential for more joined-up services and a fairer deal for our communities. We are committed to making this transition work in a way that truly improves people's lives."

Elections for the new shadow unitary authorities in Surrey are scheduled for May 2026, with new authorities expected to become operational in April 2027.



It's also good to have a personal flood plan: think about who can help you in the event of flooding, where you can go and store possessions and what you would do with any pets. Check that your insurance policy covers you for flooding.

Make sure you know where the stopvalves are for your water, gas and electricity supplies and prepare a flood kit which you can grab in the event of a flood. Store important documents somewhere safe - preferably high up.
