## Cleaner and greener communities




There are lots of things that people can do themselves to make their neighbourhood a cleaner, greener safer place to live and help and support is at hand.

The aim of #KeepSpelthorneClean is to encourage people to take pride in their local neighbourhood by:

- not dropping litter (put it in the bin or take it home with you if the bin is full)
- not letting dogs foul streets and other public places (use a bag and a bin)
- not dropping chewing gum on pavements (use the bin)
- not covering walls with graffiti (paint a graffiti wall or join an art class)
- not fly tipping (use a recycling centre)

Getting involved is easy and rewarding. It's a great way to make new friends and share skills.


#### Here are some ideas:

### **Litter Picks**


There are lots of litter picks held in Spelthorne throughout the year and everybody is welcome to join in. Keep an eye on the fantastic activities and achievements of the Spelthorne Litter Pickers by visiting their Facebook page: www.facebook.com/groups/611220539772010

We will support individuals and groups if you want to arrange a litter pick. Our Neighbourhood Services team can supply a range of equipment including bags, litter pickers, signage and gloves and our teams can collect and dispose of litter collected as part of your community litter pick.

We can also help you with a risk assessment for your event and help to publicise it through our webpage and posters. It doesn't have to be a huge area that you litter pick, it can just be your local street or community space.

Are you part of a Residents' Association? If you can arrange for your road to be kept clear of cars we can arrange a street sweeping, separate to our regular schedule.

Are you a local business that would like to take ownership of your area or street? We can offer sponsorship opportunities.









