Arts & Cultural Survey 2024











Context

Between the 1 October and 8 December 2024 Spelthorne Borough Council consulted with members of the public at a range of events and activities across the summer, to understand what arts, cultural and heritage activities they are currently engaging with and what they might like to see in future.

123 respondents completed the 2024 survey and the data/findings have been presented below. 88% were residents of Spelthorne.

A similar surveys were carried out by Spelthorne Borough Council in 2021 and 2023. Where possible the surveys have been compared to gain greater insights about our community as well as create a baseline for Arts and Cultural engagement in the borough.

187 respondents completed the 2021 survey.

289 respondents completed the 2023 survey.









Engagement in 2024

27% of respondents visited an arts and cultural activity in Spelthorne during the survey period

Satisfaction in 2024

100% Strongly Agreed/Agreed they enjoyed the activities they visited

88% Strongly Agreed/Agreed they would like to have more arts and cultural activities locally

94% Strongly Agreed/Agreed activities like these make them feel like it is a good place to live

97% Strongly Agreed/Agreed that the activities were good value for money












The 2024 survey asked respondents 'What other Leisure activities would you like to see happening locally?' (e.g arts, culture and heritage activities, sports and physical activities and community activities) 4 themes emerged from the responses:















'Borough wide arts festival, with workshops, heritage open day events, guided history walks'

'Self defence classes, museum tours, art galleries, a place for a mixture or arts, hospitality and culture'

'Comedy nights, outdoor cinema, more riverside activities, outdoor sport and fitness classes'

'More local skills clubs and showcases of different cultures'

'Events in parks e.g picnic in the park, exercise classes and family trails'

'Sports, climbing and paddle'











'Family events, affordable river trips'

'Affordable craft workshops, local history events,

'Leisure centres are no longer affordable - more free open days for the community'

'Craft markets that are affordable to sell at, affordable clubs and workshops'
