The Spelthorne Borough Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 198 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 hereby make the following Order—

Interpretation

Effect

- **3.** (1) Subject to article 4, this Order takes effect provisionally on the date on which it is made.
- (2) Without prejudice to subsection (7) of section 198 (power to make tree preservation orders) or subsection (1) of section 200 (tree preservation order: Forestry Commissioners) and, subject to the exceptions in regulation 14, no person shall:
 - (a) cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy; or
 - (b) cause or permit the cutting down, topping, lopping, wilful damage or wilful destruction of,

any tree specified in the Schedule to this Order except with the written consent of the authority in accordance with regulations 16 and 17, or of the Secretary of State in accordance with regulation 23, and, where such consent is given subject to conditions, in accordance with those conditions.

Application to trees to be planted pursuant to a condition

4. In relation to any tree identified in the first column of the Schedule by the letter "C", being a tree to be planted pursuant to a condition imposed under paragraph (a) of section 197 (planning permission to include appropriate provision for preservation and planting of trees), this Order takes effect as from the time when the tree is planted.

The Council has made the Order because:

The Council's policy is to promote Tree Preservation Orders to safeguard and ensure the retention of trees, which contribute significantly to the amenities of a locality, when it is expedient to do so. It is considered desirable to retain the trees, the subject of this Order because of their significant contribution to the visual amenities of the locality.

The Order took effect, on a provisional basis, on 27th June 2025. It will continue in force on this basis for a further six months or until the Order is confirmed by the Council, whichever occurs first.

Spelthorne Borough Council will consider whether the Order should be confirmed, that is to say, whether it should take effect formally. Before this decision is made, the people affected by the Order have a right to make objections or other representations about any of the trees, groups of trees or woodlands covered by the Order.

Your comments must comply with regulation 6 of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012 – see overleaf. Copy of Regulation 6 of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation)(England) Regulations 2012

Objections and representations:

- 6(1) Subject to paragraph (2), objections and representations:
 - (a) shall be made in writing and:
 - (i) delivered to the authority not later than the date specified by them under regulation 5(2)(c); or
 - (ii) sent to the authority in a properly addressed and pre-paid letter posted at such time that, in the ordinary course of post, it would be delivered to them not later than that date;
 - (b) shall specify the particular trees, groups of trees or woodlands (as the case may be) in respect of which such objections or representations are made; and
 - (c) in the case of an objection, shall state the reasons for the objection.
- (2) The authority may treat as duly made objections and representations which do not comply with the requirements of paragraph (1) if, in the particular case, they are satisfied that compliance with those requirements could not reasonably have been expected.
